

B.E.S.T 2013 : Rules and Entry Form

Format

There will be eight regionally-based groups, each comprising up to 16 players. Some groups may have more players than others, and the average rating of the players in each group will vary. The draw for groups will be seeded by rating.

As in previous years, invitations are sought from Northern Ireland/Ireland, and if sufficient entries are received one group will be based there. Should a group prove viable the group winner will need to be prepared to travel to the mainland for the quarter final round and subsequent rounds if they get through. The quarter final involving the Irish winner could potentially be scheduled just before or after the BMSC if that is convenient.

The eight group winners will qualify for the quarter-finals of BEST. The draw for the quarter-finals onwards will be random, and will take place in July/August, after the group finals have been completed. The final will take place on the weekend of October 26th/27th October, location to be confirmed. The first and second round matches will be best of 7 games, the third round best of 9, and the zone final will be best of 11. The quarter-finals will be best of 15 games; the semi-finals best of 17 games, and the final best of 19 games.

If a group has only two rounds prior to the group final, rounds 2 and 3 dates should be used for the first two rounds. In exceptional circumstances, and with the organisers' permission, these dates can be extended, but it is strongly recommended that they are kept to. If it turns out to be impossible for both players to agree on a date for their match, the game will be awarded to whichever player was willing to play on the closing date for the round.

Adjudications

It is envisaged that most matches will use Zyzyyva software for self-adjudication of challengers. If traditional adjudication is being used an independent adjudicator should be present at the match.

Prize money:

The prize fund is dependent on the number of entries. In 2012, based on 87 entries, the prize fund was:

- Ratings prize in each group: £25
- Losing quarter-finalist £50
- Losing semi-finalist £125
- Runner-up £250
- Winner £500

Ratings prizes will be awarded to the eight players, regardless of group, whose tournament rating most exceeds their rating at the start of the tournament. It is eligible only to players with ratings of 170 and under, and cannot be won by group winners.

Notes: The prizes are funded from entry money. Any unused funds will be added to the prize fund for the final. If players withdraw from the tournament without playing their matches, they risk forfeiting any prize money for which they are eligible; any forfeited money would be added to the prize fund for the final.

Entering and paying for BEST 2013

The entry fee for each round in the BEST is £10. To enter, please send a cheque payable to ‘Centrestar’ to Amy Byrne, 12 Northfield Terrace, Edinburgh EH8 7PX, along with your home address, email address and phone number (use the form at the bottom of this sheet if you wish). Alternatively, you can send £10 via Paypal to info@tilefish.co.uk (remember to allow for Paypal fees), or by bank transfer to Bank of Scotland, Account Name: Centrestar; A/C No: 06455409; Sort Code 80-22-60. If you win in Round 1, you pay a further £10 to take part in Round 2; and so on. So every time you win a match send a cheque for £10 made out to “Centrestar” to Amy at the address above.

Note: If you fail to pay promptly, you will be contacted and given a final deadline for payment. Failure to pay by this deadline will result in expulsion from the tournament.

Rules

- **Rules:** WESPA Rules version 2.0 will be used.
- **Challenges:** Five point penalty challenge will be used for all games. Where a challenge is unsuccessful there will be a penalty of five points per word which is added on to the move score.
- **Concessions:** A player can offer to concede a game at any point, although their opponent is not obliged to accept the concession. The score at the moment of concession should be recorded (see "Deciding game" below).
- **Deciding game:** If a match requires a deciding game (for example, if a 1st round match is tied at 3-3), the player who is ahead on spread starts in the final game. If the spreads are level, the players will draw for start.
- **Tied match:** If a match is tied on games (for example 3.5 each in Round 1), the player who is ahead on spread wins the match.
